The 34<sup>th</sup> **Train Show & Swap Meet** will be held on <u>Sunday, September 15<sup>th</sup></u>, at the **Big Sky High School**, 3100 South Ave., West, in Missoula, MT. The show will run from 10 a.p. to 4 p.m. Admission is \$3.00 for visitors 16 and over; those 15 years and under are free. The **Fall Model Train Show** will be at the **Spokane County Fair and Expo Center** on <u>Sunday, October 13<sup>th</sup></u>, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The Train Show is co-sponsored by **River City Modelers** and the **Inland Northwest Rail Museum**. Admission is \$6.00 for adults 17 & over, \$3.00 for 11 to 16 years and 10 and under are allowed to enter free of charge. All scales are represented. There are operating layouts, toy trains, videos and pictures and lots of stuff to buy from a large variety of vendors. ## NMRA ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM (%AP+)



I recently had a conversation with **Phil Everett**, the AP Chairman of the 5<sup>th</sup> Division. Phil has been AP Chairman for five years and has many more yearsø experience in all aspects of model railroading. Phil is a member of the *River City Modelers* Club in Spokane and has an O-Scale home layout. Here is what Phil had to say about the Achievement Program (õAPö).

- **Q.** What does it mean to be the AP Chairman for an NMRA Division?
- A. There are many responsibilities that fall to the AP Chairman. The first that comes to mind is that the Chairman has to promote the AP to all members in the Division. Second, the Chairman must organize judging sessions that are at a time and at a place that will work for the majority of members who want to participate in the program. Third, because some of the award categories require two judges, I have to train others to assist in that task. And, finally, as Chairman, I have to assist in the documentation (paperwork) that must be submitted to the *Regional AP Chairman* and answer any questions that arise during the process.
- Q. How many 5<sup>th</sup> Division members currently participate in the AP?
- **A.** I would estimate that there are about 20 and somewhat over half of them live in the greater Spokane area.
- **Q.** What are the most popular categories for awards?
- **A.** Probably structures followed closely by locomotives and rolling stock.
- **Q.** It has been said that the AP is too complicated and involves too much paperwork. How would you respond to that statement?

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A. I canot say that I would disagree with that perception and, perhaps, neither would the NMRA. But those at the national level are trying to streamline and simplify the process. The fact remains that the program is supposed to set high standards for modeling achievements and so the requirements have to be pretty stringent to give people a reason to get better and better within the hobby.

- Q. The 5<sup>th</sup> Division covers a very broad geographical area, even larger now that more of Montana is included. How easy is it for someone far from Spokane to participate?
- A. Well, it is a problem and I dongt have a ready solution. If a modeler lives in central Montana they may be a hundred miles or more from the next modeler. They could feel isolated [with respect to the hobby] at a number of levels including socializing and sharing information with fellow modelers, having easy access to hobby shops, and participation in train shows and NMRA events.
- **Q.** What are your own plans to expand participation in the AP?
- A. I have been the 5<sup>th</sup> Division AP Chairman for five years and I sometimes feel like I have exhausted my ideas. As we speak today, perhaps I could conduct a judging session at the Spokane Train Show in October so that people could see the process and ask questions. If the modelers were present, they could interact with the audience and that could be an interesting way to expose more people to the NMRA Achievement program. [See the next article. *Ed.*]
- **Q.** How can members get more information about the Achievement Program?
