SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I was pleased to be able to attend the Pacific Northwest Regional Convention this past June in Boise, Idaho. There were several items that the Board of Directors took action on. I will not cover all of the items discussed, except for those that effect the 5th Division. They are as follows.

- The BOD received a request from the Superintendent of the 6th Division, to transfer those NMRA members that lived in Eastern Montana to the 5th Division. After a brief discussed the BOD approved this request. This approval means the 5th Division now extents all the way the North Dakota/Montana border. It also means that the Division has increased its membership by about some 20 members.
- Jack Hamilton, who is the PNR Achievement Program chairman, explained the new system that is now being used to evaluate A.P. submittals for merit and certificate awards. The new system reduces the amount of paperwork that the submitting member has to fill out. Most of the paperwork will now be filled out by the evaluator, when they evaluate the items, I.E. structures, car, engines and alike, had be submitted. During the convention I was a member of a five man evaluation team that went out to three home layouts be evaluated. The team wrote several merit awards and three A.P. certificates. Jack Hamilton later informed us that another team, in the 4th Division, evaluated a member home layout and was able to award him seven certificates that qualified him for the Master Model Railroader Award. So if you have anything that you wish to have evaluated please feel free to contact me and I will make sure that this information is passed on the Divisional A.P. Chairman Phil Everett.
- As most of you know, the 2014 PNR convention will be hosted by the 4th Division. This change in hosting the convention is due to the 2nd Division getting ready to host the National Model Railroad Association Convention and National Train Show in 2015, In Portland Oregon. Please check the PNR web site for further information on the PNR convention, which will be held in Tacoma Washington.

Lastly, as some of know, I was undergoing treatments for Cancer. I am very happy to say that the Doctors have told me that the cancer is now in total remission. I would like to thank all those who sent cards and e-mails wishing me a speedy recover. Your thoughts and prayers are greatly appreciated by both me and my family. Thank you again.

HOW TO SELL THE NMRA

Message from Kathy Millatt, NMRA Atlantic District Director:

As a new Director, I attended the Train Show in Atlanta and was really impressed with the HQ team and their sales technique. As someone who has stood at NMRA stands at large events in the UK wondering what to say that will encourage people to join, it gave me some great ideas.

The team started by asking passersby, "Are you a model railroader?" Given that they are at a train show, the normal response is "yes." The teamøs next question is "are you a member of the NMRA?" If the answer is "no" then the team tells them about the rail pass and its benefits. The pass is for six monthsø NMRA membership and only costs \$9.95. The team has a pile of nickels lined up ready to give as change although potential members can also pay by card. At the Train Show, the team was also able to give out a few goodies such as pens, mugs, Convention bags and badges to encourage signing up.

The conversion rate from rail pass to full membership is 78%. This is a hugely successful route to new members having started people on a membership for six months.

Of course, having started a new member on a six month package, it may be worth recapping what we have to offer as it is easy to overlook the benefits that we do have. I personally have found the strongest benefit is the local Divisions. At our local UK show, I added a map of the UK showing where all the Divisions are based and it drew a lot of attention.
