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JUST A THOUGHT . . . from John Bilahorka, Tri-City Model Railroaders

One of the drawbacks to having structures built from kits on your layout is that if you build it exactly like the instructions tell you to do, you end up with the same structures a lot of other people have. This is not necessarily bad due to the quality of a lot of today's kits, but there are a couple of things you can do to get some individuality on your layout. One thing you can do is to surround it with lots of details and in an interesting setting. Another tact would be to combine it with other kits or scratch built structures into a larger complex. The third method would be basically a combination of the first two. One of my favorite structures is Tylick Tools from Bar Mills which I decided to use on my waterfront as a seafood processor. This particular structure has a rather unique shape so I snuggled it up close to a scratch built warehouse, added a free lance deck and pier that runs the entire length of the complex (17"), and added as many details as make sense. Once I add a couple of fishing boats out front I hope to have an interesting scene rather than just a unique building similar to what others have built.

Many of you may be looking at the picture here and may be seeing what appear to be lobster traps. Before you email telling me that lobsters are not indigenous to the Northwest let me assure you that I know that. What you believe are lobster traps are really lubester traps. Remember that I am modeling circa 1968 and at that time there was a species of crustacean know as the blue toed lubester found in a small section of the Pacific Northwest.

It was thus named due to the similarity of the claw shape to that of a big toe and it had a slightly bluish tinge that deepened to a GN Big Sky Blue as it went into heat. The meat of the lubester, while similar in appearance to lobster, when prepared properly was said to have tasted like chicken and when overcooked by more than 37 seconds was used as soles for heavy duty work boots. The lubester was first discovered in the late 1950's and was believed to have been the offspring of a geoduck with a Maine lobster. The story has it that the lobster was discarded by visitors to Maine who after returning home felt it would not really be a good pet for their kids much as the decision made by New York visitors to Florida have resulted in alligators inhabiting the sewers of New York. Unfortunately for the lubestermen of this area the lubester bonanza was relatively short lived. Starting in the early 1980's the catches started getting smaller and completely died out by the late 1980's. Lasting only 30 years it was believed that they had not been fished out but had merely changed their diet to that of vegetarians which the lubestermen were never able to figure out. In 2002 a resurgence of interest in the lubester was seen following rumors that the lubesters had actually "returned home". After a series of calls, FBI agents Mulder and Sculley agreed to investigate the sudden disappearance of the lubester but shortly after that their series was cancelled and interest again died out. The complex is still standing, however today it is a Starbucks. Ah progress.

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SP&S CONVENTION FUN!!! By Shirley Sample

Bob & I had the opportunity to travel to Klamath Falls, OR in June to attend the SP&S RY Historical Society convention. This is always a fun convention & in 2010 will be in Spokane!

The feature tour for the Convention was on Thursday, June 25th with a trip to Train Mountain in Chiloquin, OR which is about 30 miles north of Klamath Falls. This was the "Triennial" at Train Mountain with people & their equipment from all over the world participating.

Train Mountain currently has 69,900 feet (13 ¼ miles) of 7 ½" gauge mainline track and 133,250 feet (25 ¼ miles) of

total trackage, which includes yards, sidings, and connector tracks. In the 2004 Guinness World Records Train Mountain is recognized as the "Longest Miniature Hobby Railroad". We also stopped at the Collier Logging Museum just north of Chiloquin. Below are of some of the trains that were operating that day.
